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GREETINGS





MINISTRIES WITH PURPOSE

THE JOHN MAXWELL GLOBAL YOUTH INITIATIVE

On April 17th, 2019, Renascence participated with the youth attending Oasis of Hope Ministries in a world-changing youth movement that empower youth to be the change they wish to see in the world. During the JMT Global Youth Initiative, Renascence owner, Donnamarie Newkirk who is a certified member of the John Maxwell Team, hosted the local event. The Maxwell Team has a goal to reach 500,000 young people during the year of 2019 across the world! Youth who attend these events participate in various exercises empathizing making good choices that positively affect themselves and others. Renascence utilized the John Maxwell iChoose curriculum and Teen Action Choices from Whole person Associates. The children were equipped with information to explain how growth is a part of their

own personal attitudes. The children participated in role plays to learn how attitude and value to self can inspire and steer them toward intentional fulfillment of their purpose. They also participated in a segment to discuss bullying and how choices can impact the outcome for both observers, and the bullied individual.

The events are FREE and open to all children and youth groups, ages 8-18. The events are available throughout the year in educational, group, or religious environments. Primarily held during the months of April and October, Global Youth Initiative, founded by John Maxwell, has become the primary program utilized by Renascence Empowerment & Wellness.

EMPOWERMENT LEARNING GROUPS

During 2019 the men studied The Blessing by Kenneth Copeland and the women studied God's Will For You by Gloria Copeland. KING'S KIDS & YOUTH EMPOWERED SPIRITUALLY (YES!)

Our youngest worshippers at Oasis are the King's Kids and YES! students. We make sure their needs are met spiritually with age-appropriate lessons and lots of hands-on activities. Thematic units are used to teach the children. Sessions are held Sunday mornings and each Wednesday night. We have a dedicated team of teachers and Instructional Assistants working with the children and refreshments are served during each session. We give special thanks to parents/guardians for faithfully bringing the children to church.

Wednesday nights from 7:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. is sheer excitement as Bible Study takes place for the adults, VIP's, YES! and King's Kids. Various themes/series are taught throughout the year for the adults and the youth can be found participating in lots of projects, interactive play and hands-on learning. Snacks are served and everyone enjoys God's word.

VIP'S BIBLE STUDY

In 2019 our goal was to continue teaching the Word to our youth so that they will know and understand the Word and be able to apply it to their own lives. Also that when they hear the Word taught or preached, they will be able to know if what is being taught is from the Word. We expanded our Wednesday night Bible Study from one Wednesday a month to two a month (2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month). This has been very successful. VIP's are engaged and involved. We thank God for his guidance. The adult teaching team worked together wonderfully. We are studying the book Acts. We have finished studying Acts 1 thru 19. In 2020 we will begin our studies with Acts 20. In all of our getting we want to get understanding of the Word.

VIP'S SUNDAY EXPERIENCE

We thank God for the Sunday Experience. The Lord laid on Dr. Braxton Henderson's heart to begin a study on Sundays which would be different from their Wednesday Bible study. The youth gather together and learn in their own environment and discuss things that directly relate to their own lives with a biblical perspective. The Sunday experience has been received well by the VIP's and God had truly blessed. Plans are to continue the Sunday experience in 2020 with the help of the Lord.

LEARNING EXPERIENCES

During 2019, the VIP's were in charge of the 4th Sunday morning service. They presided over the service as worship leaders every 4th and 5th Sunday. During 2019- June through December 5th Sunday- the VIP's were in charge of the complete service including ministering the Word. September 29, 2019 was Oasis of Hope's celebration of Family and Friends' Day. The VIP's were in charge and we especially enjoyed the skit, dancing and in general how well our youth conducted themselves. To God be the Glory. We are endeavoring to prepare our youth with the knowledge of how to conduct an orderly service run by the Holy Spirit. This year they did well, and are still learning to be accountable and responsible.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

In 2019 we introduced a new plan of community service for the VIP's. They continue to help out in whatever way they can within Oasis of Hope Ministries such as Community Day, assisting with the King's Kids and YES! on 1st and 3rd Sundays and on 1st and 3rd Wednesdays. During the summer of 2019 the VIP's offered their services to Oasis members. They were able to serve 3 family members of Oasis by clipping hedges, washing dishes, cleaning rooms and garages and doing some yardwork. Some VIP's had an opportunity to help cook as well. This was a great success and we hope to expand this next year. One of our goals was for the VIP's to come together and get to know each other. We believe that this has been accomplished for most of the VIP's. They have bonded together in so many ways. We pray that this will continue.

STEAM DREAMS

We launched “STEAM Dreams”, a program that allows youth to explore their imaginations and creativity to make their dreams become a reality through science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics. We were able to hire Janelle Inman as our STEAM Program Coordinator. We hosted both school-based and community-based STEAM events this year!

We continued to partner with Athletes for Computer Science and Microsoft to teach computer science fundamentals and coding to 4th and 5th grade students in the Warren County School district.

We expanded our reach and currently work with about 50 4th grade students at Dabney Elementary School in Vance County Schools District.

On Saturday, March 30th, 7 girls participated in Microsoft’s DigiGirlz event at the Microsoft at the Streets of SouthPoint Mall. The girls were introduced to coding and women in STEM. After a presentation, the girls were able to create their own game using “makecode”. The girls began by creating “sprites”, which are their own characters, and then coding instructions for the game. Each of the participants learned something new and gained new skills.



STEAM DREAMS IS A PROGRAM THAT ALLOWS YOUTH TO EXPLORE THEIR IMAGINATIONS AND CREATIVITY TO MAKE THEIR DREAMS BECOME A REALITY THROUGH SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ART, AND MATHEMATICS.

We established great partnerships with North Carolina State University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill to support our educational programs. Undergraduate students from NCSU’s School of Design created prototypes and design layouts for our Creating Success Mobile Learning Lab. Computer Science undergraduate students at UNC serve as College Student Facilitators for our school-based STEAM Dreams program.

We received funding from the Protolabs Foundation to support our STEAM Dreams programming. We are also looking forward to partnering with Betabox Labs in 2020 for our school-based program.

We are continuing to seek financial support for our Creating Success Mobile Learning Lab with the goal of launching pilot programs in 2020.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our 10th Annual Community Day was a huge success and was our biggest event! Special thanks to Microsoft for sponsoring this year's event. The Community Day snapshot is included in this report. We hope to continue to grow the event to serve our community.

We hosted a series of “Simple + Beneficial” Health Workshops in 2019. 
